or nearly 40 years, it lay forgotten. It was a disease long thought eradicated, but polio or poliomyelitis is among us still.

In North America, the widespread use of polio vaccines since 1955 led to a dramatic reduction of the incidence of disease. But now, an estimated 60,000 Canadians are at risk of developing what is known as the late effects of polio.

West Park Hospital's Post Polio Clinic is the only one of its kind in Ontario. With the development of a new comprehensive training kit, the clinic is making its expertise available to health professionals from various disciplines throughout the province and across the country.


